4-H Members of the America's Funniest 4-H Club spent their afternoon hiking at Willy's Cider Mill.

The Helping Hands 4-H Club met to experience some apple goodness in an "All Things Apple" meeting. They started with an apple walk, getting to taste 7 different apple varieties and choosing their favorite. They then made apple soap and finished by making yummy caramel apples decorated with their favorite toppings. Everyone left with at least one piece of apple knowledge they didn't have at the start of the meeting.





The Ewes and Friends 4-H Club made homemade Mozzarella cheese.

We started with 1 gallon of store bought whole milk and 1 gallon of raw milk from a local farm store, and ended up with 2 quite different products, and a lot of leftover whey!

Raw milk whey and mozzarella on the left, store bought milk whey and mozzarella the right (and combined whey in the middle). The kids all loved it - the mozzarella on the right was smoother and less salty, and on the left was closer to a string cheese texture and saltier, due to the amount of salt used and kneading/ stretching during the formation stage.

## OTSEGO COUNTY 4-H MEMBERS PARTICIPATED IN THE NORTH AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL LIVESTOCK EXPOSITITION IN LOUISVILLE

The New York State 4-H Livestock Program is proud to announce that this year they had two teams participate in the North American International Livestock Exposition in Louisville, Kentucky. New York State 4-H had teams participate in Livestock Skillathon and Livestock Judging contest. This year the Skillathon contest had 22 state teams from across the country participate, the largest number of teams ever, and 34 state teams participate in the Livestock Judging Competition.

This year's Livestock Judging contest consisted of 11 classes of animals including beef, sheep, swine and meat goats. Beyond just judging, every contestant then had to give 4 sets of reasons on justifying their placings to the judges.

The Livestock Skillathon contest consisted of both individual and team questions. The team had to answer questions on quality assurance, livestock nutrition and animal performance and marketing. For the individual portion of the contest 4-H members had to participate in six stations including Hay evaluation, wool evaluation, Breeds of livestock, equipment used in the livestock industry, meat cut identification and a quality assurance problem.

2023 NY State 4-H Dairy Teams earn National Title and high honors this Fall in Dairy Quiz Bowl, Junior Dairy Management, and three Dairy Cattle Judging Contests

The Junior Dairy Management contest is a skill-a-thon event covering at least 9 different areas of the dairy field. Here in New York, we call this our Dairy Challenge contest. Youth at all age levels can participate on a local level at their county fairs, and later at the state contest held at the N.Y. State Fair, which is coordinated by the Cornell PRO-DAIRY Program and selected County Cornell Cooperative Extension Youth Educators . The top 4 senior level youth become the N.Y. State 4-H Dairy Management Team to compete at the Junior Dairy Management Contest held at the All-American Dairy Show in Harrisburg, PA. The Dairy Challenge and Junior Dairy Management Contest are educational activities that provide participants an excellent opportunity to evaluate top quality animals, receive experience in evaluation and decision-making, and demonstrate knowledge and skills in dairy management through stations in dairy cattle selection, linear trait analysis, diseases and biosecurity, dairy cattle health and management, meats and dairy product evaluation, feed management, identification of grains, forages and by-products, biology of lactation and mastitis, dairy product evaluation, facilities, farm safety, and farm business management. This well-rounded approach benefits our dairy youths learning and our dairy producers of the future. The 2023 NY State 4-H team took top honors with a 2nd place finish at the Junior Dairy Management contest. The team members were Nathan Foss, Wyoming Co, Evelyn Kersmanc, Otsego Co, Julia Vunk, Otsego Co., and Hadessa Adsit, Oswego Co. The team was






